Newsletter - September 2016

After a much needed and very welcome wet start to the growing year the summer weather was windy and dry. This seems to have become a regular pattern and we will have to adjust our gardening techniques to cope. I found that the runner beans made a welcome windbreak for some of the smaller plants but I also made use of netting to reduce damage.

In general the site looks good and plots are both productive and attractively managed. There are one or two plots needing attention and by the time this newsletter is published the site will have been inspected and any problem areas noted.

MANAGEMENT

I am sorry to report that Rachel Kingston has resigned from the committee and given up her plot due to heavy commitments and lack of time. We are grateful for her support and hope that she will return to allotment gardening when time allows.

Our secretary John Currell takes responsibility for managing the allotments and carries out regular inspections of the allotments with the help of a small team. We would like to remind you that it is the responsibility of the plot-holder to maintain the grass paths around their plot(s) by keeping them level and mowing on a regular basis. As we now have a mower available for use at a very reasonable price of £1 per session, there is really no excuse for not keeping your paths in good order. Those of you with plots adjacent to the field should also maintain a clear area between your plot and the hedge and not use the hedge as a rubbish dump. In the future we plan to re-establish the track adjacent to the hedge and new sheds etc should be sited three meters from the boundary line.

SITE MAINTENANCE

The central driveway and grass parking area have been kept in order by the volunteer mowing group. This is much appreciated and if anyone wants to help with this please let us know.

Francis Biggerstaff and Robin Beattie have been invaluable in offering advice and helping with repairs and maintenance of equipment. One problem that occurs on a regular basis is damage to the mowers when they are tipped on one side to allow access to the blades and under-tray for cleaning. It is important to tip the mower so that carburettor and air cleaner are uppermost or oil will flow into the air cleaner and the mower won't start.

There have been some issues recently with obstruction to paths and adjacent plots by fruit trees that have spread beyond their intended site. If you have an issue with such a tree please discuss with the owner or bring the matter to the attention of Francis, Robin or John Currell who will assess the situation and deal with the problem if necessary.
